## World Congress of Anaesthesiologists 2020: It's coming, make sure you don't miss out

Dr Jannicke Mellin-Olsen, WFSA President, said, "The World Congress is always a truly inspiring week, not least because it is the only anaesthesiology event that unites colleagues from all over the world to learn more and share their experience. It is a great opportunity to catch up with old friends and make new connections."

To open WCA2020, two leading figures from the global health community will be giving the Harold Griffith lectures. Edna Adan Ismail, has been identified as one of Africa's most influential women. She is at the forefront of the fight for women's maternal health in Somaliland, which has one of the highest rates of maternal mortality in the world.

Joining Edna Adan on stage will be Professor Christina Maslach, Professor of Psychology at Berkeley, University of California, and eminent expert in occupational burnout and professional wellbeing.
